MSME exhibits new track to the students





Debkanya Banerjee Semester exams are pending due to the lockdown. Colleges and Universities under UGC are looking at Commission's decision on it in the next few days. The UGC may hold another meeting to accommodate the regional convenience of the universities. Colleges may hold online tests on their own. When the lockdown gets over they can choose a date for a pen paper assessments.

The issues related to the holding of tests, online classes, and the new academic meeting, two committees were framed to investigate the methods for directing tests in colleges in the midst of the lockdown. One committee is led by Haryana University Vice-Chancellor R.C. Kuhad, to look into the ways of conducting exams in universities amid the lockdown. The other committee to suggest measures to improve online education is led by Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) V-C Nageshwar Rao.

The other board of trustees shaped to recommend measures to improve online training. Both the boards have presented their reports to the UGC on Friday, 24th April 2020. The government is currently expected to give a guideline for colleges and universities by ahead of schedule one week from now depending on the suggestions.
